From a series of articles published in The Philatelist some of which were authored by W. Dudley Atlee. The Spud Papers described forgeries made by the Spiro brothers in Hamburg, Germany. The Spiro forgery of the Philippine 1863 5c issue is described in Spud Paper No 7.

[Bellars, H. and Davie. \(1864\)](#). **The standard guide to postage stamp collecting. Giving the values and degrees of rarity**. 2nd edition, pp. 130 (p87). publ. John Camden Hotton, Piccadilly, London.

The second edition is described as revised and corrected and listing around 300 more stamps not included in the first edition. This early guide to stamp collecting includes a catalogue of stamps unusual in that the rarity of stamps is provided. For the Philippine issues, the rarity given is generally 'very rare', where the rarity although the 1854 5c issue is described only as 'rare'. Of the 1854 issues the 10c issue is not listed. The catalogue describes the earliest issue as being without a value.

Brown, Mount.

[Brown, M. \(1862a\)](#). **Catalogue of British, Colonial, and Foreign Postage Stamps**. 1st edition 62pp. (p29). publ. F. Passmore, London.

The first edition was published in May 1862 just weeks after Frederick Booty published his catalogue ([Booty, 1862a](#)). However, Browns' catalogue was more successful and considered to be more complete. The second edition was published the following month in June.

The second edition was published in June 1862. The book was plagiarised by [Kline \(1862\)](#) and Brown had taken steps to prevent the introduction of Kline's work to Great Britain.

Addenda to the catalogue were published in [The Stamp Collector's Magazine](#).

In the 3rd edition of the catalogue, revisions to the format took place following contact between Mount Brown and Dr. Gray of the British Museum. The number of stamps listed also expanded and details of forgeries began to be included (although none for the Philippines).

The third edition was plagiarised by W.H. Wright writing as "[A Collector](#)" (1863).

Price list with mainly the newspaper issues of 1890 and 1894 listed.

Brown, William

Catalogue listing of the 1890 issues. An introduction in the January issue (p2) explaining the rationale of this list is the recent demand of 'old issues' and the enormous rise in prices for these stamps making it difficult to complete a collection. The remedy for the new collector is to collect 'new issues' taking 1890 as a commencement year (also the Jubilee year of the postage stamp. These lists were provided in The Philatelic Journal of Great Britain with the intention to publish in a book format once varieties or additions have been identified.

Description and illustration of types of postal cancellations used in the Philippines. Provides comments also on the use of Re-integro, Inutilizado and Revisado cancels as well as the use of hole punches and the "Recargo de Consumos" stamps

The second edition is described as revised and corrected and listing around 300 more stamps not included in the first edition. This early guide to stamp collecting includes a catalogue of stamps unusual in that the rarity of stamps is provided. "Doctor Thebussem".

Doctor Thebussem was the pseudonym of Mariano Pardo de Figueroa (b. 1828, d. 1918).

The first edition of Kpankla was issued as [Pardo de Figuero \(1870a\)](#). In Kpankla Section 4 (p16) mentions the scarcity and high cost of 1r and 2r issues from 1854 to 1863 and notes that the "CORROS" error cannot be found at any price. Section 8 of Kpankla (p40) provides a table describing the comparative spread of correspondence between 1867 and 1869 in various countries, including the Philippines.

Earee, Robert Brisco (Rev.)

Revision and enlargement of 1st edition noting new techniques employed to produce the forgeries.

[Earee, R. \(1906\).](#) **Album weeds, how to detect forged stamps.** 3rd edition, vol 2. 709pp. (pp. 206-215) publ. Stanley Gibbons, London, England.

Revision and enlargement of 2nd edition and now published in 2 volumes, volume 2 contains countries M to Z. The forgeries described are from the period 1854 to 1864.

Various reprints exist (e.g. published serially in [Weekly Philatelic Gossip the Philippines sometime between Mar 1935 and Nov 1935](#)), [1937](#), [1950](#)).

Eckhardt, William J.

Section from a larger article titled "The underworld of stamps". Illustrates and describes a genuine example and a deceptive forgery of the 1863 5c issue. A useful comparison.

Evans, Edward Benjamin.

A reprint of a series of articles that appeared in the Stanley Gibbons Monthly Journal which provide a glossary of philatelic terms.

The philatelic dictionary (or manual of the stamp collector) included a bibliography of publications and journals for various countries. The main section comprised a catalogue which the Manuale-Dizionario was stated to be a complement and guide to [Album Universale](#). The catalogue is not illustrated.

An anonymous collector's exhibit providing a journey into the development and use of the domestic mail services in the Philippines during the Spanish period including stampless mail, stamped covers, official mail, postal cards and military mail. The exhibit was compiled by Nigel Gooding in July 2023 and updated September 2024.



Filatelic Facts and Fallacies.

Filatelic Facts and Fallacies was a monthly magazine first issued in October 1892 and was published by the stamp dealer W. Sellschopp & Co. based in San Francisco, USA. It was described as the only publication of its kind issued on the Pacific coast. In 1900 it was reported to go to 20,000 different addresses. The magazine ceased publication in September 1901 when Mr Sellschopp moved to Hamburg to set up a new business and was likely to be too busy to publish a philatelic magazine.

Although the early issues contained adverts for cheap sets of Philippine stamps, greater interest in the articles published can be seen after 1898.

In addition to the articles attributed to **Filatelic Facts and Fallacies** the following were also published in the journal: [Phillips, H \(1898\)](#).

Reflection on the changing world especially following the memorable was of the USA with Spain noting that the stamps of the Porto Rico, Cuba and the Philippine Islands had been unpopular have at once gained a popularity which is likely to hold. The article notes that large remainders which for years had been treated as dead stock are now finding an outlet although the rarities are likely to be sought after and command a very high price.

Account from [Madrid Filatelic \(1898b\)](#) of the table of the number of stamps of the 1898 issue for Cuba. Porto Rico and Philippines with the note that it is likely that the 4m and 4c, along with some of the higher values will soon become exceedingly scarce.

Letter from Mr Doscher of 7 June 1899 in Negros which refers to an article in the [Weekly Philatelic Era \(1899b\)](#) regarding stamps surcharged 'Resellado' and that the stock of stamps held in Iloilo was surcharged with the Resellado surcharge and they have been seen on covers cancelled at various towns. Record that the post office and all government building in Iloilo were burned down. The surcharged stamps were used in Iloilo, Cebu and Bacolod and several other cities and that there were said to be 200 sets. (Also recorded as [Doscher, 1899](#)).

Report of a large quantity of Philippine remainders now in the possession of W Sellschopp. The article contains descriptions of many marginal inscriptions of sheets from the 1880 and 1890 series of stamps. The reported formats of the 1896 2c and 10c issues are of interest as this is an early account of the formats of these particular stamps. Partial sheets with marginal inscriptions are offered for sale.

Biography of Wilhelm Sellschopp and the history of W. Sellschopp & Co. The description notes that the largest lot of stamps ever acquired at one time were two-thirds of a million of unused Philippine Island stamps purchased in the spring of 1900.

Closing remarks on the last issue of the magazine. Notes that last year American dealers were quietly buying up all the more desirable stamps of Hawaii, Philippines, Cuba and Porto Rico, which could generally be purchased cheaply remarking that available supplies in Europe are largely exhausted.

“Hamburgensis”

Unidentified pseudonym of an author writing in The Philatelic Journal of Great Britain and The American Journal of Philately.

Regarding the remaining stock of Philippine postage stamps was sold to the firm Edward A Keller & Co., of Manila. Fredrico Schenkel published a price list for the resale of this stock (see [Schenkel 1900](#)). The account records Mr Schenkels' trip to Europe and the London in his rather unsuccessful attempt to sell his stock. It is recounted that eventually sold them to a Paris buyer at a much-reduced price. Mention is also made of a fire in Antwerp the previous year which destroyed ten boxes, reportedly of the common varieties. (reprinted in [Hamburgensis, 1902c](#)). The article is continued in [Hamburgensis, 1902b](#)).

Hyde, Wheeler & Co., (catalogue).

A quarterly price list. Although the Philippine stamps are listed prices for are only given for used examples of the 1864 to 1867 issues; the only stamp available mint is the 1859 10c issue.

A look back at the 1892 paper 'Bric-A-Brac' by J.W. Palmer who mentions that reprints are being offered for sale as perfectly good stamps which includes those of the Philippines.

Konwiser, H. (1928). **The Arthur Hind Prize Collection Shown at the Collectors Club**. The American Philatelist, vol 41 no 8, p621. (May 1928).

Description of the collection of Arthur Hind (described as the world's greatest general collector) on a rare occasion for it to be exhibited in the USA. The collection includes a sheet of the 1854 10c carmine issue.

Lincoln, William Simpson.

(b1844, d1922) opened his first stamp shop in London in 1859 and reputed to be the first stamp dealer in London.

The first edition published in 1898 did not include any reference to the Philippines. The second edition is illustrated, although the illustrations are generally too small to be useful. In Chapter 2 the history of Spain as depicted on postage stamps is described which provides background. In Chapter 9 on extraordinary stamps a brief note records that the early stamps of the Philippines were rough in design.

Magazine of Philately, The

The Magazine of Philately was a monthly magazine first published in May 1883. The magazine was the organ of the Institute of Philatelists, of Liverpool. It was published by The Universal Foreign Stamp Company and the first five issues (up to September 1883) were edited by G. Henry Readdy until his retirement. The subsequent issue comprised numbers 6, 7 and 8 was issued in December 1883 with a new editor, George Birtwhistle and announcement that the magazine now incorporated the Universal Philatelic Magazine. However, this edition appears to have also been the last issue.

Later editions are recorded published by Sefi, Pemberton & Company Limited. The publication was later taken over (in 1956) by Robson Lowe Ltd. The magazine was later incorporated into Lowe's **The Philatelist** in 1981 as **The Philatelist and PJGB**.

The **Philatelic Review of Review** was included as free supplement to **The Philatelic Journal of Great Britain** from January 1892 until it was later incorporated as a feature into the magazine.

Philatelist, The.

The Philatelist was first published in December 1866 by Stafford Smith & Co, Brighton and Hall & Co., London. as an illustrate magazine for stamp collectors. After the sixth issue the published changed to Stafford Smith & Co, Brighton and Marlborough & Co., London. In December 1868 Marlborough & Co became E. Marlborough & Co. The magazine ceased publication in 1876. The first six issues were reprinted in 1874 under the title Papers for Philatelists.

It was edited by Dr Charles Viner.

The cover sheet of all the magazines featured an illustration of the Philippines 1854 10c issue.

Trifet published the Stamp Mercury in the 1860s on of the first philatelic journals in America. He produced a stamp catalogue. Also F. Trifet's Monthly Circular. Orbituary provided in London Philatelist (1899) The late Mr Trifet. The London Philatelist, vol 8 no 96, p334. (December 1899).
