Extensively illustrated study providing background information on the first stamps of Cuba and Puerto Rico of which the 1r and 2r values were used in the Philippines including a detailed study of the plates and identifiable positions. Details of forgeries are included and an Appendix includes official documentation. A separate translation of selected paragraphs is appended. According to [Sarrias \(2022\)](#) the study was prepared by Carlos Echenagusia Garcia but was not credited. An update of the plating study is provided in [Echenagusia \(2025\)](#).

Basic description of the 1854 issue. Notes that the stamps were printed from copper plates, paper was wove, medium to thick and the gum was yellowish in colour and not pleasant to taste. Notes that a fine used 1r CORROS example exists in the Tapling Collection in ultramarine (compared to slate blue and dark blue noted in catalogues).

Notes that forgeries exist made by Sperati (a proof of one such example is illustrated).

Suggests that the 5c exists in two types, presumably a different or a retouched plate and therefore a second printing. Notes that although the stated number of printed stamps was 5,000 it seems unlikely that the plates would have needed retouching before 5,000 had been printed. Notes that the Tapling Collection has blocks and sheets of a "second printing" (with coarse lines) for all four values.

Harradine indicates that for second printing, the colour is generally fresher on most examples and not as muddy, especially the 2r issue.
