Unidentified pseudonym of an author writing in The Philatelic Journal of Great Britain and The American Journal of Philately.

The account records Mr Schenkels' trip to Europe and the London in his rather unsuccessful attempt to sell his stock. It is recounted that eventually sold them to a Paris buyer at a much-reduced price. Mention is also made of a fire in Antwerp the previous year which destroyed ten boxes, reportedly of the common varieties. (reprinted in [Hamburgensis, 1902c](#)). The editors of the Journal have also included notes and observations. The first instalment commences with the proposed issues of 1847 followed by the description of the 1854 to 1855 issues.

Harradine, Peter W. A.

(b.1942, d.2020). In 1975 Peter founded the Philippine Philatelic Society (PPS) and was the editor of the Philippine Philatelic Society Journal between 1975 and 1991. Peter also wrote the Philippine Postage Stamp Handbook, 1854-1982 in 1987.

A biography is provided in the [Philippine Philatelic Journal \(2013\)](#) and in [Becker and Gooding \(2020\)](#). Peter worked at the Philatelic Section of the Post Office in London, UK.

[Harradine, P. \(1975a\)](#). **The Philippines first issue - Some information - Some queries.** Philippine Philatelic Society Journal, vol 1 no 1, pp. 9-10.

Basic description of the 1854 issue. Notes that the stamps were printed from copper plates, paper was wove, medium to thick and the gum was yellowish in colour and not pleasant to taste. Notes that a fine used 1r CORROS example exists in the Tapling Collection in ultramarine (compared to slate blue and dark blue noted in catalogues).

Notes that forgeries exist made by Sperati (a proof of one such example is illustrated).

Suggests that the 5c exists in two types, presumably a different or a retouched plate and therefore a second printing. Notes that although the stated number of printed stamps was 5,000 it seems unlikely that the plates would have needed retouching before 5,000 had been printed. Notes that the Tapling Collection has blocks and sheets of a "second printing" (with coarse lines) for all four values.

Harradine indicates that for second printing, the colour is generally fresher on most examples and not as muddy, especially the 2r issue.

There were no significant updated specialised catalogues of the Philippines after those of Palmer (1912) for some 75years until the Handbook produced by Harradine. Although it draws upon earlier work it also includes many anecdotal notes including extensive details on proofs. Some of these details are attributed to notes provided by a Warren Browne and observations from the Tapling Collection. [Unfortunately, the original notes have been lost and many of the proofs described (at least for the 1890 series) have yet to be seen, they do not exist in the Tapling Collection of the British Library].

The Handbook also notably provides a description of the plating of the 1854 issues in Appendix A.

Example of advert of L Harris & Co with 1854 10c issue used as a banner, although no Philippine stamps are offered for sale.

This catalogue was published in Madrid in 1898 by L. Harris and Company, and was sold at his establishment in Carmen Street, Madrid for 75 centimos. The Philippine section appears to be an exact duplication of the catalogue produced by Galvez (1898). The 1898 issues are provided in an Appendix.

Heijtz, Stefan.

This presentation is an overview of world's first stamps issued for the franking of official mail that Spain issued between 1854 and 1855. The presentation lists, describes and illustrates the Spanish "Correo Oficial" stamps and shows outstanding pieces and usages of these issues on cover. The use of these stamps was eventually extended to the Spanish colonies, by a Royal Order of 23 January 1857 that made their use mandatory effective 1 January 1858, and the presentation includes one example of their use in the Philippines.

Messrs Higgins and Gage formed an auction company in Pasadena, California; shortly after the business was incorporated Higgins died, but Alex Gage decided to continue business under the corporate double name.

Hill, Percy A.

Account of the setting up of the early mail service and the first 1854 stamp issue. Discusses the printing in 1863 by La Ilustracion Filipina of Scott #14 to 20. Provides an account of the retail of stamps in Manila outside of post offices but these stores were abolished in 1870. Notes that there were 28 post offices in the Philippines in 1875. The editor notes that the author has passed away.

An account of the Manila blockade and the involvement of German warships protecting German merchant interests including the carrying of letters from Manila to Hong Kong. Includes illustration of covers and details of the German warships involved in the blockade mentioning that in bygone years Straits postage labels were used to prepay a considerable amount of correspondence emanating from the Philippine Islands.

Hull, Arthur Frederick Basset.

A brief footnote mentioning that in bygone years Straits postage labels were used to prepay a considerable amount of correspondence emanating from the Philippine Islands.

The section on the first issue of 1854 reportedly includes all known shades. Also sheets of 10c and 1r values are included. A prologue is provided by Jose Barreras. [The cover note suggests that the 1854 10c carmine sheet is the only known example; however, a second sheet is known in the Tapling collection].

IPPS News

The **IPPS News** was a newsletter from the International Philippine Philatelic Society it contained short articles as well as news. The first edition was published in October 1981. In general, it was published quarterly although there was a break in publication after volume 3 no 3 in 1983 until January 1986 when the **IPPS News** resumed with volume 6 no 1, (with only three editions that year).

In 1991 the **IPPS News** was renamed the **IPPS Newsletter**.

Linda Stanfield was the editor between 1983 and 1985. Linda Stanfield and Eugene Garrett were joint editors during 1986 with Eugene Garrett taking over as sole editor in 1987. Robert Yacano was editor between 1988 and 1994.

The bibliography is currently missing newsletters between 1994 (vol14 no 3) and 2003. The Philatelic Literature Review indicates that the last issue was December 2003 (no 73) when it merged with the **Philippine Philatelic Journal**.

Notes that information provided on the Philippines is very limited and at times inaccurate which is often repeated without verification. Announces his intention to publish the most complete work possible based on his collection, those of friends, the Tapling Collection and with collaboration of Peter Harradine. [This work does not appear to have been published].

The author limits this article to highlighting some of these observations. The article suggests that there were distinct plates for the 1854 10c issue with the whole plate remade and probably also for the 5c issue. It is suggested that the number of sheets printed may be greater than the reported numbers. The article also discusses the 10c black proof/non-issued stamp and mentions a block of nine [The largest block currently known to me is a block of six].

Comments are provided as to the use of postal cancellations of that period.

[Although opinion varies it is currently believed that there was a single plate for each of the issues which have undergone various retouches and re-engravings and not two plates as suggested].

Ernest Kehr travelled from the United States to Manila to act as a judge of the International Philatelic Exhibition. He describes the exhibition as an impressive "local" event and noting that Philippine collectors of that time had a limited concept of the qualifications for "international" competition. Kehr notes that even the largest collections contained only single examples or pair at best of the first issues, with no endeavours to "plate" or illustrate the various types. The finest items was noted to be an 1857 cover franked with a 10c bisect stamp.

Kline, A.C.

A pseudonym for John William Kline.

[Kline, A. \(1862\)](#). **The stamp collector's manual**. 48pp. (p35). publ. A.C. Kline, Philadelphia.

Although reported to be the first stamp catalogue in the United States, 'being a complete guide to the collectors of American and foreign postage and despatch stamps', the catalogue was a plagiarism of Mount Brown's catalogue which has earlier been published in London ([Brown, 1862](#)).

A second edition was issued in 1863.

Kline, John William.

Konwiser, Harry M.
