Need a copy. A comprehensive bibliography of books and pamphlets dealing with the philately and postal history of Spain and her former colonies. The main listing offers 1785 titles arranged chronologically from 1514 to 1981. Most of the material is of Spanish origin, but a considerable number of foreign publications are included. [Aracil \(2011\)](#) heavily references this bibliography.

[Brooklyn Philatelic Club, National Philatelic Society & Staten Island Philatelic Society. \(1889\). **Catalogue of the collection of postage stamps exhibited at the Eden Musee.**](#) With descriptive notes by J. W. Scott 44pp. (p32). publ. The Committee, New York.

The descriptive notes provide what Scott describes as stating sufficient to give the public some idea of the extent of this fascinating amusement. The Philippines was exhibited by William Thorne and occupied exhibits 171 to 173. Scott noted that due to the great profusion of surcharging the country was one of the hardest to fill with satisfaction to say nothing of the great expense involved. The catalogue includes several adverts relating to American stamp dealers.

Records that the IPPS was founded in September 1974 by Frank and Linda Stanfield. At the time of writing the IPPS had over 250 members for 11 countries with approximately 225 in the US. Records two publications are published: a journal and a newsletter. Account that the IPPS has sponsored the publication of Gooding (1995) and Peterson (1997), and that the IPPS has become the primary source for literature on Philippines philately. Provides account of there being two volume 1 no 1 of the journal with different dates, the second one was the first 'official' one after the IPPS became 'official'.

One of the first stamp catalogues in English which combined a stamp catalogue and stamp album. There were many later editions including that updated by [Viner \(1871\)](#). See [Whymper \(1864\)](#) for the third edition

“Orient”

Unidentified pseudonym of an author writing in Gibbons Stamp Monthly.

[Orient. \(1942\)](#). **The Far East takes the stage.** Gibbons Stamp Monthly, vol 15 no 6, pp. 117-118 & 122. (1 February 1942).

Mention of the stamps of the Philippine Islands, noting the philatelic interest in the first issue is great although the stamps are not described as beautiful. The later issues are noted as providing a good display cheaply.

Orwinican Stamp News

The Orwinican Stamp News was first published in January 2020 as a free, electronic newsletter magazine by Orwin Austria. Featuring items of general interest with a particular focus on flaws and errors of the Republic Period it included occasional items on Spanish-Philippine cancels and flaws. (Pages are not numbered in the publication).
