Sellschopp, Wilhelm Karl Georg Ludwig.

(b.1862 d.1938) Wilhelm Sellschopp was the proprietor of the stamp shop W. Sellschopp & Co in San Francisco, California, USA and published the monthly magazine **Filatelic Facts & Fallacies**. He was based in the USA during the 1890s but returned to Germany in 1901. A biography and history of W Sellschopp & Co is provided in [Filatelic Facts & Fallacies \(1900e\)](#).

Schenkel, Federico C.

Advert from Schenkel offering stamps of the Philippines in exchange for others from Spain, Cuba, Puerto Rico and other countries. Offering perforated Philippine stamps at discounted prices and current issues at nominal prices.

Federico Schenkel was a stamp dealer based in Manila. An auction was held on 28 December 1899 where the American Government sold by auction the entire stock of postage stamps remaining in the Hacienda Publica of Manila which were turned over by the Spanish authorities in August 1898. The auction was won by Ed A Keller and Co. of Manila for the sum of \$50,300 (Manila currency - estimated to be about £5,000 sterling) and comprised approximately:

30million stamps (postage, provisional postage and newspaper stamps)

100,000 postal cards

Schenkel was appointed as the agent for the onward sale of this stock. He produced a catalogue listing stamps from 1880 to 1898 available for wholesale in quantities of 10, 100 and 1,000. Also offered were sets of 120 stamps. Schenkel also notes that in the stock purchased a large number of damaged stamps, pale and soiled.

It was reported in the [Philatelic Journal of Great Britain](#), later reproduced in the [American Journal of Philately \(1902\)](#), that by the end of 1900, less than 100,000 stamps had been sold. A detailed account is provided about the dealings of this remainder lot in the two Journals which was eventually sold to dealer in Paris. Schoeller, Adolphe.

Scott noted that due to the great profusion of surcharging the country was one of the hardest to fill with satisfaction to say nothing of the great expense involved.

The catalogue includes several adverts relating to American stamp dealers.

The magazine suspended its activities on two occasions: between 2002 and 2003, and 2007 to 2012. It was re-launched with a new website on 11 September 2012 under the direction of Jose Maria Sempere with the assistance of various editors. Mainly considering Spanish philately it includes some articles relating to the Philippines and used in Marianas. The web site appears to have been largely inactive since July 2017.

Between January 1867 to 1874 it was edited by George Overy Taylor.

Records that the stamps were first sold in the UK by an unaware Birmingham dealer. On investigating further, it appears that the forgeries were supplied by the notorious Englehardt Fohl who offered to provide 150sets of four stamps (the fourth being a colour variety of the 10c value).

Philippines Isles, the forty types of each value will be shown complete, with several of the leading English collectors lending Mones plates that they have complete.

Stanley Gibbons Monthly Journal.

In 1891 the [Stanley Gibbons, Limited, Monthly Journal](#) was renamed **Stanley Gibbons Monthly Journal**.

The [Stanley Gibbons, Limited, Monthly Journal](#) was first issued in 1890 shortly after Charles Phillips had bought the business from Stanley Gibbons. It was renamed in 1891 to **Stanley Gibbons Monthly Journal** which commenced with volume 2.

In June 1908 the **Stanley Gibbons Monthly Journal** was discontinued as new magazine had been introduced in 1905, the [Gibbons Stamp Weekly](#). However, producing a quality weekly magazine was too much, and in December 1910, the [Gibbons Stamp Weekly](#) ceased and in January 1911 the **Stanley Gibbons Monthly Journal** returned until it ceased with the outbreak of war in 1914.

In October 1923, the **Stanley Gibbons Monthly Journal** returned for the third time replacing the [Stanley Gibbons Monthly Circular](#) with volume numbering reset to volume 1. The new journal lasted until September 1927, when it was replaced by [Gibbons Stamp Monthly](#).
